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I — AWARD OF SILVER STAR — Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular 2, First United States Army, 4 January 1945, the Silver Star is awarded to the following enlisted man:

Technician Fifth Grade Marshall W. Walker, 34 608 075, (then Private First Class), Medical Detachment, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action on 16 December 1944, in Germany. During an intense German attack on his battalion's position. Private First Class Walker, medical aid man, valiantly driving a jeep across a road junction constantly pounded by enemy artillery and mortar fire, made three trips to rescue wounded stranded between our lines and the enemy's. Fastening two litters to the hood and another across the back seat of his vehicle, Private First Class Walker, heroically disregarding his own safety, successfully evacuated a maximum number of casualties to the battalion aid station. By his inspiring courage and exemplary actions, Private First Class Walker materially heightened the morale of those witnessing his deeds and was instrumental in aiding the many casualties he evacuated. Entered military service from North Carolina.

II — AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (MISSING IN ACTION) — Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular 2, First United States Army, 4 January 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following enlisted man who is now missing in action:

Private Otto W. Colbert, 33 431 206, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 17 December 1944, in Germany. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

III — AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL — Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular 2, First United States Army, 4 January 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following officers and enlisted men:

Captain Arnold Goldberg, 01 533 323, Medical Administrative Corps, 331st Medical Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 16 December 1944 to 31 December 1944, in Belgium. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Captain Philip L. Lallanche, 01 544 645, Medical Administrative Corps, 331st Medical Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy on 19 December 1944, in Belgium. Entered military service from New York.

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First Lieutenant Glynn Salyers, O1 300 534, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 25 December 1944, in Belgium. Entered military service from Kentucky.

Technical Sergeant John L. Mikalauski, 36 741 895, (then Staff Sergeant), 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 16 December 1944, in Germany. Entered military service from Illinois.

Staff Sergeant Nicholas G. Holgash, 33 464 810, Medical Detachment, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 17 December 1944, in Germany. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

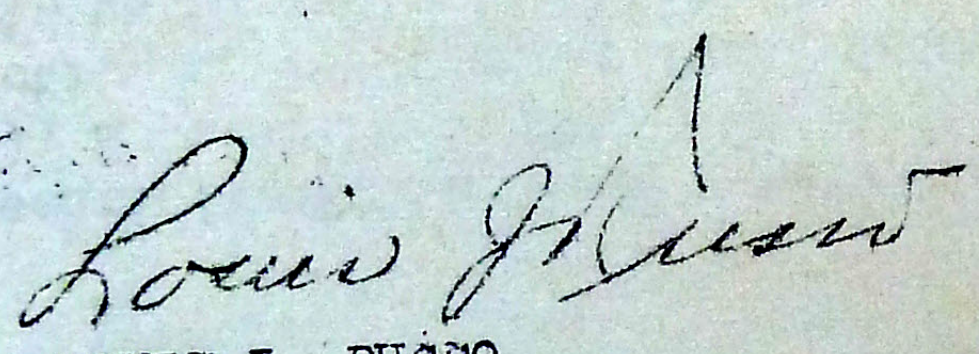
