I. GENERAL.

1. RESCISSIONS. General Order No. 5, this headquarters, dated 15 March 1943, and Annex No. 1 thereto, is rescinded.

2. EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDER. This order becomes effective this date.

3. ASSIGNMENT OF AREAS. a. The officers indicated below will be responsible for the safety and security of the personnel, buildings, and equipment in the areas indicated:

Commanding General, Division Artillery	Blocks 6 and 20
Commanding Officer, 422d Infantry	Block 3
Commanding Officer, 423d Infantry	Blocks 4 and 19
Commanding Officer, 424th Infantry	Block 5, sewage treatment plant
Commanding Officer, Special Troops	Blocks 1, 7, and that portion of Block 2 East of SCHOOLHOUSE ROAD

b. Commanding Officer, Special Troops, will coordinate the guard of the following Division Troops:

Division Headquarters and Headquarters Company and Band  
106th M. P. Platoon  
106th Signal Company  
106th Quartermaster Company  
806th Ordnance Company (LM)  
81st Engineer Battalion (C)  
331st Medical Battalion



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(4) The normal place of duty of the Division Officer of the Day on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays will be in the Division Adjutant General's Office. He will notify the officer and non-commissioned officer on duty in Division Headquarters and each unit Officer of the Day where he may be reached at all times. He may sleep in his assigned quarters.

(5) The Division Officer of the Day will verify the existence of complete, up-to-date orders and instructions for the guard at each guardhouse and will familiarize himself with such instructions and orders as pertain to his duties as Division Officer of the Day.

(6) In case of a fire or other similar emergency, he will immediately notify the Post Officer of the Day.

(7) The Division Officer of the Day will at all times during his tour of duty be on the Post and at a place where he may be readily reached. Such places as movies, USO shows, ball games, etc., are not considered as places where an officer may be reached readily.

c. Duties of Unit Officers of the Day. In addition to such other duties as are prescribed for the unit Officers of the Day, they will:

(1) Be familiar with Division Fire Regulations.

(2) See that all members of the guard are "fire-conscious" and that each member of the guard is familiar with the location of all fire phone boxes and that they know how to place calls properly on the fire phone and by normal telephone channels (General Order No. 9, this headquarters, dated 17 April 1944, Subject: "Division Fire Regulations").

(3) See that all members of the guard are familiar with these regulations.

(4) Notify immediately the Division Officer of the Day in case of a fire or other similar emergency.

(5) Submit through his unit commander a written report of comments or recommendations which will improve the safety and protection of the Division area. Negative reports are not desired.

d. Old and New Unit Officers of the Day. (1) Old and new unit Officers of the Day will report to the Commanding Officer or his representative daily at such times as they may prescribe.

(2) Unit Officers of the Day will remain at or near their guard house throughout their entire tour of duty except when at mess or otherwise engaged in official duties in connection with the guard. They will keep the commander of the guard and the Division Officer of the Day always informed of their whereabouts.



d. Commanders of the Unit Guards. (1) All duties as prescribed in FM 26-5.

(2) To be familiar with Division Fire Regulations.

(3) To see that all members of the guard are "fire-conscious" and that each member of the guard is familiar with the location of all fire phone boxes and that they know how to place a call properly on the fire phone and by normal telephone channels (General Orders No. 9, this headquarters, dated 17 April 1944, Subject: "Division Fire Regulations.")

(4) To see that all members of the guard are familiar with these regulations.

e. Sergeants of the Unit Guards. (1) All duties as prescribed in FM 26-5.

(2) To be familiar with Division Fire Regulations.

(3) To see that all members of the guard are "fire-conscious" and that each member of the guard is familiar with the location of all fire phone boxes and that they know how to place a call properly on the fire phone and by normal telephone channels (General Orders No. 9, this headquarters, dated 17 April 1944, Subject: "Division Fire Regulations").

f. Corporals of the Unit Guards. (1) All duties as prescribed in FM 26-5.

(2) To be familiar with Division Fire Regulations.

g. Privates of the Unit Guards. (1) All duties as prescribed in FM 26-5.

(2) To be especially watchful for fires and to report any fire discovered.

(3) To familiarize themselves immediately with all fire call boxes on their post.

(4) To awaken all occupants of the building on fire on or near the scene of the fire.

(5) To know, understand, and enforce all general orders for sentinels.

(6) To know, understand, and enforce all special orders for the post to which assigned.

(7) Post Exchange Guards.

(a) Commanders referred to in Section I, paragraph 3, will include in their guard at least two (2) privates of the guard for each



Post Exchange in their area.

(b) Guards will be posted daily from 1700 hours until closing time and on Sundays and holidays from 1400 hours until closing time.

(c) Guards will not be armed, but will draw night sticks from the Exchange Manager upon being posted and will turn night sticks in to the Manager upon the closing of the Exchange.

(d) Guards will maintain order at all times. In case of a disturbance the guard will call his corporal of the guard.

(e) Guards will assist in seeing that paper and other trash is placed in the proper receptacles.

h. Guard Mount. Formal or informal guard mount will be held daily.


i. Motor Patrols. Motor patrols will be established by commanders referred to in Section I, paragraph 3 above, to insure protection against accidents, disturbances, fire, and subversive activities. Patrol vehicles will not exceed twenty-five (25) miles per hour on the Post and will reduce that speed when traveling through congested areas.

j. Changes. Changes or amendments to this General Order will be inserted in all copies.

## II. GUARD PERSONNEL.

1. COMMISSIONED. a. Division Officer of the Day. In garrison a Division Officer of the Day will be designated by this headquarters and announced in the Division Daily Bulletin. On weekdays the Division Officer of the Day will be the senior unit Officer of the Day. On Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays the Division Officer of the Day will be detailed from a roster of field officers maintained by this headquarters. Officers in the grade of captain occupying field officers' positions will be carried on the roster. Each commander concerned will submit to this headquarters forty-eight (48) hours in advance the name of his unit Officer of the Day.

b. Unit Officer of the Day. Unit Officer of the Day will be detailed by each commander, referred to in Section I, paragraph 3 above, by roster. This roster will include all officers in each command except those excused under the authority contained in FM 26-5. Commanders concerned will assure themselves, insofar as practicable, that the officer detailed as Officer of the Day is from the same unit from which the non-commissioned officers and privates of the guard are drawn.

c. Commander of the Guard. Commanders referred to in Section I, paragraph 3 above, may detail an officer as commander of the guard at their discretion. In the event an officer is not detailed as commander of the guard, the senior non-commissioned officer of the guard will assume these duties.

2. ENLISTED. A minimum of non-commissioned officers and privates will be detailed to assure the safety and security of the personnel, buildings, and equipment within assigned areas.

3. ROSTERS. Details for the guard will be published twenty-four (24) hours in advance. Guard details will be made from a complete unit under the regularly assigned leaders, i.e., from a complete squad or platoon (including officers and non-commissioned officers before calling upon another squad or platoon).

4. DUTIES OF PERSONNEL. a. General. (1) All personnel mounting guard will be familiar with these regulations.

(2) The duties outlined herein will be required of personnel in general and are not intended to limit the issuing of additional instructions by the commanders referred to in Section I, paragraph 3 above.

b. Duties of the Division Officer of the Day. (1) All duties as prescribed for the field Officer of the Day as outlined in FM 26-5.

(2) The old and new Division Officer of the Day will report to the Division Adjutant General at 1300 hours daily. The Division Officer of the Day will be on duty for twenty-four (24) hours.

(3) The normal place of duty of the Division Officer of the Day will be at his unit guardhouse on weekdays. He will notify the officer and non-commissioned officer on duty in Division Headquarters and each unit Officer of the Day where he may be reached at all times.



(4) The normal place of duty of the Division Officer of the Day on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays will be in the Division Adjutant General's Office. He will notify the officer and non-commissioned officer on duty in Division Headquarters and each unit Officer of the Day where he may be reached at all times. He may sleep in his assigned quarters.

(5) The Division Officer of the Day will verify the existence of complete, up-to-date orders and instructions for the guard at each guardhouse and will familiarize himself with such instructions and orders as pertain to his duties as Division Officer of the Day.

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
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
