AWARD OF PURPLE HEART II

I -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular 2, First United States Army, 4 January 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following officers:

Lieutenant Colonel Henry P. Killman, O 342 898, (then Major and Lieutenant Colonel), 106th Quartermaster Company, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 22 October 1944 to 1 February 1945, in England, France, Belgium, and Germany. Entered military service from Maryland.

Lieutenant Colonel William T. Manahan, O 230 536, 806th Ordnance (LM) Company, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 22 October 1944 to 1 February 1945, in England, France, Belgium and Germany. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Captain Herbert N. Blanchard, O 469 680, (then First Lieutenant), 331st Medical Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 16 December 1944 to 31 December 1944, in Belgium and Germany. Entered military service from Massachusetts.

First Lieutenant Ivan H. Long, O 1 238 578, 424th Infantry, (then 423d Infantry), United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy from 18 December 1944 to 21 December 1944, in Belgium. Entered military service from Michigan.

II -- AWARD OF PURPLE HEART -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular 2, First United States Army, 4 January 1945, the Purple Heart is awarded to the following enlisted men for wounds received in action against the enemy in Northwest Europe, on the date shown:

Private First Class Normand J. Chagnon, 31 359 061, 517th Parachute Infantry Combat Team, United States Army, on 15 January 1945. Entered military service from Massachusetts.

Corporal Matthew J. Misch, 31 073 535, 643d Tank Destroyer Battalion, United States Army, on 14 January 1945. Entered military service from Massachusetts.
