I -- AWARD, POSTHUNOUS, OF SILVER STAR --- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular 2, First United States Army, 4 January 1945, the Silver Star is posthumously awarded to the following officer:

Second Lieutement Maxwell M. Brown, O 548 027, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action on 13 January 1945, in Belgium. When his advancing platoon was suddenly halted by devastating machine gun fire from well-concealed hostile positions, Second Lieutement Brown ordered his men to take cover. To draw fire revealing the enemy's exact location to his deployed platoon, he courageously advanced toward the German lines until fatally wounded by withering blasts from their guns. By his valiant sacrifice and inspiring action, Second Lieutement Brown enabled his men to locate the camouflaged emplacements, withdraw with a minimum of casualties, and flank the positions, thereby neutralizing a well-planned enemy trap. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

II -- AWARD OF PRONZE STAR MEDAL .... Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Circular 2, First United States Army, 4 January 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following officers and enlisted men:

Lieuterant Colorel Lamar A. Welch, 024 391, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 13 January 1945, in Belgium. Entered military service from South Carolina

Second Lieutenant Victor Capelle, 02 005 576, (then Technical Sergeant), 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 25 December 1944, in Belgium. Entered military service from South Carolina.

Second Lieuterant Delbert V. Edgette, 02 005 568, (then Staff Sergeant) 424th Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 16 December 1944 to 17 December 1944, in Germany. Entered military service from Illinois.

Technical Sergeant William C. Davis, 37 453 726, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 23 December 1944, in Belgium. Entered military service from Nebraska.

Staff Sergeant Michael S. Mosher, 32 148 852, (then Sergeant), 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 16 December 1944, in Germany. Entered military service from New Jersey.
