II — AWARD, POSTHUMOUS, OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL — Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 21, Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is posthumously awarded to the following officers:

First Lieutenant Isaac N. Alexander, O1 175 626, 592d Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on 16 December 1944, in Germany. Entered military service from South Carolina.

First Lieutenant Daniel B. Woolcock, Jr., O 548 044, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy from 16 December 1944 to 23 December 1944 and 13 January 1945, in Germany and Belgium. Entered military service from New Jersey.
