AWARD OF SILVER STAR SECTION
AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

I — AWARD OF SILVER STAR — Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 21, Fifteenth United States Army, 4 Warch 1945, the Silver Star is awarded to the following officer and enlisted man:

Second Lieuterant Dale R. Carver, 0 551 259, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action on 15 January 1945, in Belgium. When the snow-covered route, vital for the movement of supplies and reinforcements, was blocked by mines planted on and near a bridge and the entire area was being blasted by concentrated German artillery and mortar fire, Second Lieutenant Carver and an enlisted man volunteered to clear the route. Second Lieutenant Carver, under such intense enemy barrages that he was repeatedly forced to seek cover in the icy waters of the stream beneath the bridge, worked tirelessly probing for the mines by hand. Undaunted by the ever present danger of the exploding shells and possibility of detonating a mine, Second Lieutenant Carver and his assistant, unaided by mine detectors, removed and neutralized twenty-seven mines, clearing the urgently needed road. Entered the military service from Colorado.

Private First Class Elmer L. LaFleur, 37 588 907, 424th Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action on 15 January 1945, in Belgium. When the snow-covered route, vital for the movement of supplies and reinforcements, was blocked by mines planted on and near a bridge and the entire area was being blasted by concentrated German artillery and mortar fire, Private First Class LaFleur voluntarily accompanied an officer to clear the route. Private First Class LaFleur, under such intense enemy barrages that he was repeatedly forced to seek cover in the icy waters of the stream beneath the bridge, worked tirelessly probing for the mines by hand. Undaunted by the ever present danger of the exploding shells and possibility of detonating a mine, Private First Class LaFleur and the officer, unaided by mine detectors, removed and neutralized twenty-seven mines, clearing the urgently needed road. Entered military service from Minnesota.
