I -- ANNOUNCEMENT OF COMBAT INFANTRY COMPANY -- A minimum of sixty-five per cent (65%) of the Table of Organization strength of Company "C", 424th Infantry Regiment, having been awarded the individual Combat Infantryman Badge for satisfactory performance of duty in ground combat against the enemy in Belgium and Germany, under the provisions of War Department Circular Number 408, 17 October 1944, as amended, is hereby announced a Combat Infantry Company.

II -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 21, Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following officer:

Lieutenant Colonel Walter S. Glenney, O 328 646, 424th Infantry, (then Special Troops, 106th Infantry Division), United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 17 November 1944 to 4 March 1945, in England, France, and Belgium. Entered military service from Texas.

III -- AWARD OF PURPLE HEART (OAK LEAF CLUSTER) -- In addition to the Purple Heart previously awarded, a bronze Oak Leaf Cluster is awarded under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 21, Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, to the following enlisted man for wounds received as a result of enemy action in Northwest Europe, on date shown:

Staff Sergeant Harold V. Nelson, 17 082 962, (then Private First Class), 423d Infantry, (then 424th Infantry), United States Army, on 19 December 1944. Entered military service from Missouri.

IV -- AWARD OF PURPLE HEART -- Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in Memorandum Number 21, Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, the Purple Heart is awarded to the following enlisted men for wounds received as a result of enemy action in Northwest Europe, on date shown:

Technical Sergeant Raymond A. Rabb, 14 021 341, 424th Infantry, United States Army, on 18 December 1944. Entered military service from North Carolina.

Private First Class Richard R. Robinson, 36 417 758, (then Private), 424th Infantry, United States Army, on 16 December 1944. Entered military service from Michigan.
