AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following officers and enlisted men:

Second Lieutenant Franklin S. Barlow, O2 006 767, (then Chief warrant officer, Adjutant General's Department, Division Headquarters, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 22 October 1944 to 8 May 1945, in England, Belgium, France, and Germany. Entered military service from Ohio.

Technician Fifth Grade John J. Breen, 36 579 794, Infantry, Headquarters, Division Special Troops, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 17 November 1944 to 8 May 1945, in England, Belgium, France, and Germany. Entered military service from Michigan.

Major Martin M. Fischbein, O1 692 140, Medical Corps, Division Headquarters, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 17 November 1944 to 8 May 1945, in England, Belgium, France, and Germany. Entered military service from New Jersey.

Captain Joseph J. Grosh, O1 695 118, Medical Corps, Division Headquarters, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 17 November 1944 to 8 May 1945, in England, Belgium, France, and Germany. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Captain Robert E. L. Harvey, O 343 350, Adjutant General's Department, Division Headquarters, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 15 October 1944 to 8 May 1945, in England, Belgium, France, and Germany. Entered military service from California.

Technician Fourth Grade Ernest T. Halonen, 37 077 728, (then Private, Technician Fifth Grade, and Technician Fourth Grade), Infantry, Division Headquarters, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 17 November 1944 to 8 May 1945, in England, Belgium, France, and Germany. Entered military service from Missouri.

Major Oswald D. Karter, O 453 344, (then Captain and Major), Signal Corps, Division Headquarters, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 24 October 1944 to 8 May 1945, in England, Belgium, France, and Germany. Entered military service from Alaska.

Captain Robert S. Lowther, O 533 428, Inspector General's Department, Division Headquarters, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 17 November 1944 to 8 May 1945, in England, Belgium, France, and Germany. Entered military service from West Virginia.
