Family	The youngest of three children, Malcolm Henry Rockwell was born in River Falls, Wisconsin, to Llewellyn H. Rockwell, Jr. and Winnona Taylor Rockwell. Malcolm had one sister, Nona Jean, and one brother, John Wesley.

Important Notes:

- The Apr-May-Jun 1996 issue of The Cub features A Day to Remember by Colonel T. Paine Kelly, 589th FAB Commander, which includes poignant references to Captain Rockwell and his "C" Battery just prior to the last day of his life.
- Malcolm was married for a short time before his death in 1944. He and his wife, Andrena, had no children.
- Malcolm's brother, John Wesley Rockwell, was my grandfather. John Wesley was a Private with the 373rd Engineers General Service Regiment. Pvt. Rockwell was married with two young children when he was killed in action, Le Harve, France, October 1944, deactivating mines. Within two months, Winnona T. Rockwell (widowed many years earlier), my great-grandmother, lost both of her sons.
- Five nieces and nephews and a handful of great-nephews and great-nieces (of which I am proudly one) survive Malcolm.
