

Queen Mary Reaches U. S. .

NEW YORK, Sept. 28 (UP)—The Queen Mary and four smaller vessels dock today with 15,775 troops.

All but the 70-odd men aboard the John B. Payne are from the European theater. The other Payne passengers are from the Far East.

The 14,512 troops on the Queen Mary included the 254th and 255th Regiments of the 63rd Infantry Division, the 67th General Hospital, Air Force personnel, 91 nurses and 91 WACs. Also aboard were 279 Navy personnel, war correspondents and civilians of the OSS, OWI, USO and Red Cross.

The hospital ship Wisteria carried 442 patients. They were taken to Mason and Halloran General Hospitals.

The Edward Richardson carried 736 troops and the Henry D. Lindsley 15.

Troops aboard the Richardson went to Camp Shanks, N. Y., for processing. Those aboard the Lindsley went to Fort Hamilton, and those aboard the Payne and Queen Mary went to Camp Kilmer, N. J.
