

## Redeployment

More than 10,000 troops from Europe are scheduled to arrive in the United States today (Monday) aboard eight troop-carriers docking at three east coast ports.

Ships and army units arriving.

At New York—(Aboard Argentina, from Le Havre) 5,214 troops including 2nd battalion of 423rd infantry regiment of the 106th division; 81st engineer combat battalion; 1644th, 1656th and 1667th ordnance supply and maintenance company; 1071st and 1148th quartermaster company service group; headquarters and headquarters service company; 926th engineer aviation regiment; headquarters and headquarters battery of 21st AAA group; 93rd fighter control squadron; 30th and 298th general hospitals; 23rd, 27th and 46th mobile records and reports squadron; 1024th counter intelligence corps detachment and 232 nurses. (Aboard Marechal Joffre, from Le Havre) 2,654 troops including the following elements of the 106th infantry division; headquarters, headquarters company and headquarters special troops, headquarters and 1st battalion, 422nd infantry regiment, 806th ordnance company, 104th counter intelligence detachment, headquarters of anti-tank, cannon and service companies, 423rd infantry regiment and 44 navy personnel. (Aboard Zenobia, originally due yesterday) 245 troops, undesignated units.

At Newport News—(Aboard Santiago Iglesias) 110 miscellaneous personnel.

At Boston—(Aboard Hagertown Victory) 1,953 troops including the following elements of the 5th army: headquarters, headquarters company, special troops, signal light construction battalion and miscellaneous personnel.
