I--AMENDMENT OF GENERAL ORDERS--So much of General Order Number 116, this headquarters, dated 23 July 1945, as reads 25 March 1945, is amended to read 25 February 1945.

ok II--REVOCATION OF GENERAL ORDERS--So much of Section II, General Order Number 171, this headquarters, dated 27 June 1945, as pertains to Lieutenant Colonel Carlton E. Stewart, 01284356, is revoked.

III--AWARD OF SILVER STAR--Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, the Silver Star is awarded to the following enlisted man:

Private First Class Harold A. Bacon, 11019503, Infantry, 119th Infantry Regiment, United States Army, for gallantry in action on 21 December 1944, in Belgium. Private Bacon displayed outstanding heroism by leaving shelter to run forward through murderous fire in an attempt to enter a monastery while the enemy was trying to put him down. Although he was hit and fell to the ground, seriously wounded in the abdomen, he raised his fire and fought his way to the monastery where he collapsed over his empty rifle in the hallway. Private Bacon's gallant actions gave his comrades the courage to rapidly enter and capture the building. Entered military service from Connecticut.
