FOD	Individuals who were determined to be dead under Public Law 490 are designated FOD (Finding Of Death). FOD is in general, the date of one year and one day after being missing in action. Sample: Two members ( Pfc

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	Antony T. Drabecki and TSgt Wade J. Verweire) of the 119th Inf Rgt (30th Inf Div) have been missing in action on 27 Sept 1944 in the vic of Rimburg (Dutch-German border). Both remains have not yet found or identified. Both their names are mentioned at the Wall of Missing at Margraten. However when engraved their names they used the FOD date which is 28 Sept 1945. At the Wall of Missing at US WWII cemeteries you even find FOD dates for the year 1946 (killed in April 1945 mentioned on the wall April 1946)

(1) -- All killed in the 25 December 1944 bombing of Malmedy by the U. S. Air Corps. Bodies were never found.

(2) -- All killed in the "Disaster in the English Channel" on 15 June 1944 when their ship was struck by a mine before landing. Bodies never recovered.

(3) -- It is not known for certain as to why these men were buried in these cemeteries, far away from the route of the 30th Infantry Division. It is thought that it just depended upon which Graves Registration Unit exhumed the bodies from the temporary cemeteries and were moved to a permanent cemetery within their zone of operation.

(4) -- It is unknown why a 30th Division KIA was buried in Hawaii.
