

Leon Sherer Baseball Star On Europe '9'

WITH THE 106TH INFANTRY DIVISION OF THE SEVENTH ARMY—Pfc. Leon Sherer, 1819 Eleventh Avenue, North, Nashville, Tenn., was recently transferred from the 28th Infantry Division to the Antitank Company, 424th Infantry Regiment of Maj. Gen. Donald A. Stroh's hard-hitting 106th "Lion" Division.

At present, Leon is on the pitching staff of the 106th Division Cubs in the Seventh Army Southern Baseball League in Europe. Sherer is known to his teammates as "Lefty."

Sherer played with the Fort Worth, Tex. team before entering the army. In 1941 and 1942 he played with Fort Jackson, S. C., club Camp Wheeler came through with two wins, with "Lefty" pitching in the Wichita national play-offs in 1943. He then shipped out for the European theater in 1944. In his first season with the 106th Cubs he has two wins and two losses to his credit.
