FORT JACKSON, Jan. 25.—The 30th Infantry division is going "over the top" again.

With an unselfish spirit that brands them worthy successors to their forbears of the Old Hickory division who went "over the top" to smash the vaunted Hindenburg line in the first World war, these self-sacrificing men of North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and Tennessee are giving their "all" in the American Red Cross drive now in progress at Fort Jackson.

Despite their meager soldier's pay, these southern patriots are more

than doing their part in the Red Cross drive with many outfits subscribing 100 per cent. Lieut. Orle L. Williams, campaign chairman in the Old Hickory division, reported the following example as indicative of the fine charitable spirit possessed by the men of the 30th:

The Cheran club, composed of non-commissioned officers of the 115th Field Artillery regiment, had a total bank account of \$29.05. At their first meeting after the start of the Red Cross campaign, members of the club promptly voted to withdraw the entire amount and donate it to the Red Cross.
