

## 30TH DIVISION TO BE HONORED IN FOUR STATES

RALEIGH, Oct. 20. (AP)—Governors of four states are participating in plans for observing "30th (Old Hickory) Division day" on Oct. 30, it was announced here today.

The 30th division originated as a national guard division from North and South Carolina, Tennessee and Georgia. The four states are cooperating and planning local celebrations.

Governor R. Gregg Cherry of North Carolina last Friday issued a proclamation commemorating the day and called upon all citizens to observe the occasion with patriotic gatherings.

Governors Ransome J. Williams of South Carolina and James McCord of Tennessee have indicated their states will dedicate Oct. 30 to the division, said Lieut. Don Bishop of New Bern, officer in charge of publicizing the event. Georgia's Governor Ellis Arnall has a policy against proclaiming "days," but indicated he would issue a statement in praise of the Old Hickory.

The 30th is standing by at Fort Jackson, S. C., where it went into the federal service on September 16, 1940. The division probably will be inactivated as an active army unit some time soon, but no announcement to that effect has been made by the war department.
