83rd DIVISION COMES HOME
—It was just 25 years ago today that a story on our front page told about the 83rd Division arriving home from France... Then it was Ohio's division... now it's pretty much our own division... and it got its training at Atterbury... and a lot of its wives at Columbus (Ind., not O.)... Said our story of Jan. 27, 1919: "Members of the 331st Infantry of the 83rd Division... composed of men from Ohio... are back from overseas duty today... and awaiting orders at Camp Merritt, N. J., to return to their homes... The regiment arrived here (New York) yesterday on the Cunarder Caronia from Brest... Second Lieut. H. M. Wayne, Salt Lake City, of Company A, 32nd battalion of light tanks... was recovering from wounds... a shrapnel when shells hit a platoon in which he was leading a platoon of light tanks near Varennes... Two German 77's demolished... he tread of his tank and captured it... As he was emerging from the debris a gas shell exploded nearby and put him out of business temporarily... Another shell exploded and scores of its splinters were embedded in his head... The 83rd is still at Camp Breckinridge, Ky... but presumably it won't stay there for the duration... and some day another of our front pages will carry a story of its homecoming—maybe from France... maybe from Tokyo... or no telling where.
